'Apps' are designed to run on certain devices and are written for a specific operating system, such as Apple iOS, Windows, or Android. The official store for the Apple iOS operating system is known as the 'App Store' and it's where you can browse and download more than 2 million apps and games to use on the iPad, iPhone, iPod Touch and other Apple devices. When your children are using the app store, you need to be aware of the risks...





What parents need to know about The App Store

IS YOUR CHILD 13+?

ell need an Apple ID. If they have used other Apple services, such as iCloud, they can sign into the App Store with the same Apple ID. If they are aged 13 and under, they cannot sign up for an Apple ID on their own, but an adult can create an Apple ID for a child.

IN-APP PURCHASES

In app parthases are optional transactions that can unlock extra hanctionality, virtual goods or unique content. Unless you change the settings, conce your child has entered a password to make an in-app purchase, they can make additional purchases for 15 minutes without re-entering a password. This makes it extremely easy for children to accidentally run up hous bills.



LOOKALIKE APPS Some developers release apps that copy the functionality, user interface and evven product names and branding of popular apps, in an attempt to trick unsurprecting users to install them. By downfoading an app from an unknown developer, your child could find their device compromised. Experts want that through app permission, hackers can

INAPPROPRIATE APPS

Scene apps and games have content that is unsuitable for privinger (hildren - even the most popular or innocatous locking apps may feature adult themed content, violence or cruelty to other people or animals, unmoderated chat, pomographic or insuit content.

THIRD-PARTY APP STORES

CREATE YOUR CHILD'S ACCOUNT

them to your family group to keep an even on their activity. Go to Settings > [your name] > family Sharing > Add family Member > Greate a Oriid Account > Next. Enter your child's birthday and tog Next. Envire the Parent Privacy Disclosure and tog Agree. With Family Sharing, you can add up to six family members to share App Store purchases, as well as "Brees and Accel Books.

SWITCH ON 'ASK TO BUY

Fycu have a child that is over 13 years of age and has their own Apple account, make sure that you only allow them to make purchases with gift cards. You can also activate the 'Aok to Boy' feature if you are using Family Sharing, so that whenever a family member who tur't an adult initiates a new purchase, a request goes to the account organiser. You can also limit what content your child can access on the

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RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASES

You can restrict your child's ability to make in agp parchases. On an KOS device, open Settings, tag General and then Restrictions. Tap Trnahin Restrictions: Nov can pot a limitation that requires a password every time there is a purchase made in the App Store or iTanes Stare.

BROWSE APPS BY AGE

To find apps and games that are right for your children, check the age ratings. On an iPhone or iPod Touch, this ca be found in the information section on an app product gage, and on an iPad or desitors, the age range is near the Buy button. On the Kids page, you can find apps for age ranges, including 5 and under, 6 to 8, and 9 to 11.

AVOID OTHER APP STORES

Put a rule in place that your child can only use the official App Store to download apps and games. Explain why it is wise to only install applications from a trusted source to ensure their device is not affected by security issues or virus attacks.

HOW TO KNOW AN APP IS SAFE TO INSTALL

Achies your child that just because they're downloading an app from an official store, it doesn't make it safe. Fake or copycat agos will offen include missipelt words and poor gammar, so always mad the app description, and double check the developer name and title for warning signs. Be wary of apps that come with a long list of permission negueets. Check the app's neviews and ratings - one star, one-line moview complaining that an app didn't work on a certain device, or that there was a balling issue, is not a good indication.

SPOT FAKE REVIEWS

nake sum they aren't vegue and generic, or overly effusive, as one developen will by to manipulate their appropriations by positing fails onlings and review. Once the number of overloads the app claims to have - the higher the sumber, the more likely it is to be safe. Now child can also check on a company's website to see if the app is available on them.
