Year 1 - Bond & Potter class

Year One have had a very exciting half term working on our 'Fire Fire' topic.

The children enjoyed our trip to the Fire Station and behaved impeccably while we were there. Their favourite parts were spraying the hose and being lifted in the fire fighters hoist!
