### Nursery, Cygnet Class


This term the nursery children have had a lovely time finding their feet and settling themselves in to the nursery routine.

### Year 1 and Year 2, Kingfisher, Owl and Woodpecker Classes







The children in Key Stage one have en-

joyed our topic 'what is special about us and our locality'. In Geography this half term we have explored the physical and human features within our local area. Mr Norman came in to speak to the children about his job at Westlands. The children have been excited to find out about the view from Wyndham hill and its surroundings. Many of the children have enjoyed sharing their topic homework with us and we look forward to seeing more being completed to show off at school.

In history the children have learned about Yeovil hospital and how hospitals have changed

In history the children have learned about Yeovil hospital and how hospitals have changed over time. They have found out about Florence Nightingale and how she changed hospitals for the better.

During Science in year 1 the children have learned about using their senses. They have explored their sense of smell, touch, sight, taste and hearing. In year 2 the children have used their understanding of the ways to keep healthy. This has included finding out about eating a well-balanced diet and making some healthy food such as smoothies and fruit kebabs. The children have thought about the importance of getting enough sleep, exercising and hygiene. We had an author visit at our school this week who shared his book called 'Lucy's blue day'. This book helps children to be aware of their feelings. Next week the children will be learning more about healthy minds through our wellbeing week. In maths the children have been working hard to understand place value with numbers up to 10 in year 1 and up to 100 in year 2. Many of the children have secured their knowledge of number bonds to 10 and 100 and have had the challenge of working out word problems too.

In English the children have focused on writing instructions, letters and descriptions through the stories Funnybones, Georges Marvellous Medicine and The Twits. The children particularly enjoyed making up their own medicine using a variety of different ingredients. In P.E the children have developed their team skills. Well done to our year 2 boys for taking part in the cross country.

We have had a fantastic first half term and are very proud of the way the children have settled into their new classes. They show such enthusiasm for learning.
